



What better way to approach the upcoming Holy Year of Mercy than to come together in the spirit of the Catholic tradition of the works of mercy. Luke 6:27-36 tells us, "But to you who are listening I say...Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do that. And if you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, expecting to be repaid in full. But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back...**Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.**"

Are you listening? Pope Francis challenges us all to listen and to act. **"Mercy...is the best thing we can feel: it changes the world"** (catholicnewsagency.com). Change starts inside each and every one of us. We must

open our minds, our ears, our eyes, and most importantly, our hearts.

On November 8, Catholics from around the Schenectady area will gather for **Called to Serve Family Sunday**; a day about learning to live the works of mercy. This day of prayer, enrichment and service is sponsored by the Works of Mercy Initiative and local Faith Formation programs. The day is about planting seeds that will lead us all to be constantly mindful of the needs of those around us and to show mercy to all those we encounter.

Workshops will focus on ways to be merciful, including visiting the sick, feeding the hungry, reaching out to the bereaved, prison ministry, working for justice, supporting veterans, and respecting life. The Holy Year of Mercy calls for all of the faithful to live the works of mercy. Participants in Called to Serve Family Sunday can take what is learned and incorporate it into daily life. The Good Neighbor Program of the Works of Mercy Initiative sends a message of love and hope for the children and families served. Children learn better when they feel better and being comfortable and confident is part of feeling better. Referrals are received from around the community, including local elementary schools, the Schenectady Department of Social Services, food pantries, parish Faith Formation programs and the City Mission. The Good Neighbor Program has provided care packages to almost 100 children already this school year. Last year, over 250 children were served. The support and generosity of the parish communities through clothing and monetary donations allows these works of mercy to continue to positively impact the world around us. Collectively we can change the world. The children we help today are the leaders of tomorrow.
